Must meet University requirements (see Graduate Admissions) as well as requirements listed below.

## **Program Admission Requirements**

• three letters of recommendation

- a letter of intent
- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution and a GPA of at least 3.00; or a master's degree from a
  regionally accredited institution and a GPA of at least 3.00 or better (on a 4.00 scale) during graduate study. Students
  with a non-CSD background, may be required to take prerequisite coursework in the basic speech, language, and
  hearing sciences depending on career plans and desired area of focus.
- GRE scores at the 33rd percentile for Verbal, Quantitative and Writing subtests, taken within 5 years preceding the
  application. Students with lower scores may be offered admission on a conditional basis if the letter of intent and
  letters of recommendation are particularly strong. The GRE requirement may be waived for students with
  demonstrated research experience (e.g. previous publications).
- 2. What are these changes necessary or desired?

This change is needed because of the addition of a new research unit into our department who will draw individuals interested in a non-clinical degree and in response to the number of requests that we have received from people who wanted to enter our PhD program without pursuing the clinical Master's degree first.
